Teach Children To Save Day

On April 22nd, we will be visiting the Cashton Second Grade classes as part of Teach Children To Save Day. Teach Children to Save Day is an educational program that was established with the aim of encouraging kids to develop a good savings habit as early as possible in their financial life. We will be teaching the kids specifically about saving money, but also about other financial matters such as spending, donating and investing.





Here are 6 tips for you to use with your own children to help teach them about money and saving.

1. Use Different Envelopes/Jars

On either envelopes or jars, have your child draw pictures of what he or she wants. This way they can visualize what they are saving for.

2. Make a Savings Goal Chart

Once you know what your child wants to save for, figure out how many weeks it will take and make a chart. You can represent each week with a box and your child can put a sticker in that box once the money from that week's allowance is set aside.

3. Set a Good Example

One of the best things you can do is let your child see that you save money too. Put money in a jar while your child is watching and tell them it's your savings jar.

4. Match Your Child's Contributions

A "savings match" can be a great way to encourage your child to save extra money and get an early peek at the benefits of a company match for a retirement savings program like the 401k.

5. Open a Savings Account
